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# Society for Marine Conservation prepares for the City of Mount Vema

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**July 07, 2021** – The Royal Mount Vema Society for Marine Science and Conservation have started to prepare to monitor developments in Mount Vema as soon as the works start to move to the territory.

The work of the Mount Vema Marine Conservation Society has been crucial during the planning phase. The Society helped find solutions to protect the marine life and now prepares to monitor developments.

The Marine Conservation Society will have one of the first permanent presence in Mount Vema and is now looking to hire more marine scientists to join its team, as more specialist vessels will be made available to the Society to better perform its tasks within His Mount Vema Majesty's realm and beyond.

The fleet of vessels which some will be newly built, will have fully equipped laboratories to help the society on its mission to work not only in Mount Vema but with international organizations to protect and preserve the ecosystems in oceans and seas, and to focus on limiting human-caused damage to marine ecosystems, aiming to restore damaged marine ecosystems, and preserving vulnerable species of marine life.

The Royal Mount Vema Society for Marine Science and Conservation which was formed by His Mount Vema Majesty King Peter Goldishman in May 20th, 2017 seeks deeper understanding on how the microbes are responsible for virtually all the photosynthesis that occurs in the ocean, as well as the cycling of carbon, nitrogen, phosphorus and other nutrients and trace elements.

Microscopic life undersea is incredibly diverse and still poorly understood. The Society says on its official Mount Vema webpage, and it works to understand the role of marine ecosystems that have barely being explored.

The work of the society includes multidisciplinary field of study and research of ocean life and physics. From Marine biology, Marine ecology, Marine chemistry, Chemical oceanography, Marine geology and Physical oceanography.

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
