



Waste management system approved – Ministry of Water and Environment

August 11, 2021 – The Mount Vema Ministry of Water and Environmental Affairs has approved the City of Mount Vema waste management plans submitted by vonMELYN.

More than six months after VSBCnews contacted the Mount Vema Ministry of Water and Environmental Affairs, following concerns from vonMELYN who told VSBCnews of delays in approval of its key infrastructure project concept, which is usually the first step before companies can start final designs of any City of Mount Vema project, the ministry has confirmed that plans have been approved.

The Ministerial team which is mostly made of consultants responsible for reviewing all infrastructure projects that may cause a significant impact on the environment in Mount Vema and beyond told VSBCnews that it needed to follow strict Royal Mount Vema environmental guidelines.

Although the collection and management of waste in Mount Vema will be the responsibility of individual districts, it is vonMELYN, the Mount Vema company that is tasked with the processing of waste within the Vema Seamount Territory.

vonMELYN plans have met the minimum waste requirement which are a set of processes and practices intended to reduce the amount of waste produced. Ministerial officials told VSBCnews today.

To achieve this, the company had to propose plans to continue consultation with all government departments which are currently managed by consultants with specialist knowledge in their field of expertise.

The aim is according to experts familiar with the City of Mount Vema project, to prevent the City from generating harmful and persistent wastes, and to promote a sustainable society. So, all departments had to agree to specific guidelines with regards to product designs and processes to set the society on a sustainable path of societal patterns of consumption and production.
